## (CENSORED)

Wheaton College prohibits the existence of this newspaper, BRAVE SON. In effect, the college has censored it in its entirety.

College rules require students to "request" permission from Student Government, the Student Publications Board, and the College Committee on Student Publications in order to publish anything. "...any attempt to circumvent these channels will be subject to discipline," the Student Handbook states.

In 1963, the college enforced that regulation against the editors of the first Brave Son. The school has warned us that they will enforce it again.

We, the undersigned editors, publish this newspaper as a concrete demonstration of our protest against this regulation, a violation of the Spirit of the First Amendment of the Constitution of the United States. We protest this censorship.
